Let us all be closer to Jesus

There are three important liturgical celebrations for the month of November: commemoration of all saints and souls, Christ the King, and the First Sunday of Advent. These three focus on one direction – Jesus Christ, the Savior. When we remember our saints and our brothers and sisters who passed away, they have only one goal, that is, to be with Jesus Christ. Some of them were already in heaven, and others are waiting to be with Him. While the Season of Advent is the anticipation of the coming of the Messiah and the memorial of His birth in the manger born of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the co-redemptrix (a co-operator with Christ in the work of human redemption).

We prepare in all these celebrations as we make our own way of being with Christ. Like the saints, we want to be with Jesus, our Savior. We pray for our beloved dead as a way of anticipating their union with Christ which at the end it benefits us because they will intercede for us when they reach heaven. We pray for them because we love them, and we love the Lord who will welcome them in His Kingdom.

According to Pope Francis on the Solemnity of Our Lord
Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe: "Jesus came not to
dominate, but to serve others. And Christians are called to do the
same, seeking the truth of Jesus' boundless love who frees us from our
weaknesses." www.vaticannews.va We are called to make Christ known to
others and make Him, the center, and the King of our lives. As He is our King,
we are called to obey, imitate, and live His life. As His subjects, we need to
listen and follow Him with all our hearts, with all our minds, and with all our souls.

The Season of Advent reminds us to be vigilant, watchful, and awake for the coming of the great gift of God the Father – His Only Begotten Son, the Savior born in the manger, a sign of humility and submission to the will of the Father. My sisters and brothers, "the gospel readings for Advent each year invite us to meditate on the mystery of waiting, and they do it by presenting us with stories of great people who knew how to wait. On the first Sunday, Jesus himself is the model as he taught his followers the spirituality of 'waiting in joyful hope'. Advent begins at the end – the promised return of Christ at the end of time. For the faithful disciple, history is a moving forward, a journey to the fulfillment of God's reign when God's Christ will return as Lord of all. We therefore live in a permanent state of Advent: watchfulness, preparation, and perseverance as we await the return of the Holy One who has already come." stories4homilies.blogspot.com May all these celebrations bring us and others closer to Jesus to prepare us in meeting Him face to face in the next life.



UPCOMING FEAST DAYS

Christmas, Dec. 25

The Christmas season celebrates the mystery of the Incarnation and the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the world: past, present and future. The mystery and feast of Christmas (the Nativity of the Lord) is second only to Easter in the liturgical life of the Church. The Christmas season begins after evening prayer on December 25th and continues through the Baptism of the Lord. The first week of the season is the octave of Christmas which closes on the feast of the Mother of God (Jan 1).

Solemnity of Mary, Jan. 1

We celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, with a feast of the octave of Christmas. This celebrates Mary's Motherhood.

The Holy Family, Dec. 26

This feast day commemorates the life of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph together. It portrays the holy family as "the true model of life." Celebrate with your family and consider praying the Holy Family Novena together in hopes that your family will be guided and faithful.

Epiphany of the Lord, Jan. 2

Epiphany means "manifestation", that moment when we suddenly understand something that previously was hidden from us. Christmas is about the Incarnation, the coming down of the Son of God to become human, one of us. Epiphany is the showing of the Christ Child's divinity, which is beginning to manifest itself in the world.
