

Jesus' Last Days

According to the Ordo, "Holy Week is the week which precedes the great Feast of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday: it includes the last days of Lent and the beginning of the Easter Triduum. During Holy Week, the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his life on earth, beginning with his messianic entrance into Jerusalem." Ordo 2023 CCCB Ottawa

We start with Palm Sunday which is loaded with impact in the life of Jesus, a life-changing moment, and a defining act of submission to the will of the Father. As he entered Jerusalem, riding a donkey and people shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David', made a conscious and sorrowful decision to pass through to his death. The Jews used palm branches to welcome Jesus, the Messiah as symbol of victory and peace. By this celebration, let us get rid of ourselves the disorder of life, ride the donkey of humility, and enter our own Jerusalem, our own suffering with the Messiah.

The Sacred Paschal Triduum is the feast of all feasts. "Through his Paschal Mystery, the Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death; by rising, he restored our life. For this reason, the Easter Triduum, when we celebrate the Suffering, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord, is the high point of the Liturgical Year. The Easter Solemnity is to the year what Sunday is to the week." Ordo 2023, CCCB Ottawa

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper commemorating the institution of the Eucharist by his words 'Do this in remembrance of me.' We also do the Washing of the Feet of the Apostles, symbolizes service and humility, the command Christ given to all of us. The transfer of the Most Blessed Sacrament to the narthex starts our vigil until midnight. As the Lord said to Peter, James and John: 'Could you not stay awake with me one hour?', let us spend an hour with the Lord in the altar of repose. On Good Friday, "the death of Jesus is at the same time his glorification. It is also God's glorification. Jesus does not die as a helpless victim of human machinations; he gives up his life freely as proof of his love for the Father and the Father's love for humanity." 365 Days with Lord, St. Paul Publications

On Easter Vigil, the night vigil signifies Christ's passage from the dead to the living which begins in darkness (sin, death) and is enlightened by the first and the candle representing Lumen Christi - the Light of Christ - just as the Church, the mystical Body of Christ, the community of believers, is led from spiritual darkness to the light of his truth. Christ's baptism, which our own baptism imitates, is represented during the liturgy by the blessing of the water of baptism by immersing (burying) the candle representing his Body into the font. This evening's service has 4 parts: 1) The service of the Light symbolizes darkness to light, death to life; 2) The Liturgy of the Word, readings and psalms help us meditate on the wonderful works of God for his people since the beginning of time; 3) Renewal of Baptismal Promises which includes the Litany of the Saints, the Easter water is blessed, new members are brought into the Church through baptism and Confirmation, and we the faithful are blessed with water and renew our own baptismal promises; 4) The Liturgy of the Eucharist, we have been fed by the Word and given new life in the waters of baptism, here we eat his Body and drink his Blood and receive the life in him that he promises.

So, this Holy Week let us join, participate, and joyfully celebrate this great event of our Christian faith. Be with Jesus, the Messiah, our Lord throughout this week!


